UNDERSTANDING THE PROCESS: VIRTUAL ADVICE & GUIDANCE MEETINGS

Long Road is an open and inclusive community; we believe in equal opportunities for all of our students – that starts from the very moment you make an application to study with us. This is why we invite our applicants to a personal Advice and Guidance Meeting with one of our experienced members of staff.

To make your experience as smooth and stress free as possible, all of our Advice and Guidance Meetings will take place virtually via videocall. We know some of you may still be adjusting to the more virtual world we find ourselves living in, but please

don't worry. We will be sending you lots of guidance on how to book, prepare for and attend your virtual meeting over the next month.

This is a super busy time of year for our Admissions Team, but we feel it is important for you to understand our process and get an idea of what is going on behind the scenes in our Admissions office!

We have set aside two days to conduct the majority of our Advice and Guidance Meetings; these days are Thursday 15 & Friday 16 February 2024.



UNDERSTANDING THE PROCESS: VIRTUAL ADVICE & GUIDANCE MEETINGS

Please be aware, due to the volume of applications, our Advice & Guidance Meetings will take place throughout the Spring & Summer Term; so please don't panic if your friends receive a meeting date before you! The timing of your meeting will not impact your offer to study.

Shortly after receiving your application, we will be in touch with further detailed information on how to book your Advice and Guidance Meeting.

You will need to book your own meeting with us using the School Cloud booking system; this allows you to choose a meeting time convenient for you and your family. Meeting slots will be available to book throughout the school day.


Keep **checking your emails** for notification on when our booking system opens!

If, for any reason, your parent/carer is unable to attend with you via the same device (e.g. a parent is at work) a feature is available which will allow your parent/carer to join your meeting from a different device. We will share further information on this with you shortly when booking opens.


MEET SCHOLAR STUDENT, WILL



TRAVELLING BY BUS

Long Road is well served by the local bus companies.
Journeys may be direct to college, or could require a change in Cambridge City Centre. The closest bus stops to the college are Robinson Way, Puddicombe Way, Long Road and Royal Papworth Hospital. Addenbrookes Hospital Bus Station is just 10 minutes walk away.

TRAVELLING BY TRAIN

Cambridge Railway Station is currently the closest station to the college approximately 1.5 miles away.

Students can then catch the FREE Long Road Shuttle Bus from Cambridge Railway Station to the College.
Alternatively, the walk from Cambridge Railway Station is approximately a 25 minutes or 10 minute cycle.



STUDENT BEN COMMENDED AT THE FOYLES YOUNG POETS AWARD 2023!

Congratulations to student Ben Heiss who, on National Poetry Day (5 October 2023), was 1 of just 85 individuals to be commended at the Foyles Young Poets Award ceremony in London!

I think I first started liking poetry when we studied it in my secondary school for GCSE. I liked how the poems we studied compacted lots of meaning into small sections. I found that I had more freedom when writing poems, compared to writing stories, because I didn't have to follow the rules too closely. I liked how it allowed you to talk about things in a way that avoids obvious meaning.

My poem was mainly inspired by my own life experiences and personal observations of other people. I was trying to write about things that are relevant to the time period we are living in, even the things that seem unimportant and trivial.

When I found out I had been shortlisted as an award winner I felt happy that my poem had been acknowledged and awarded. At the award ceremony the Top 15 winning poems were read out to a live audience in the Sam Wanamaker Playhouse at Shakespeare's Globe. All the poems will be published in an online anthology.









ALUMNI ABBIE SECURES COMPETITIVE DEGREE APPRENTICESHIP!

Former Long Road Scholar, Abbie, graduated from Long Road this summer after successfully completing her A Levels in Business, Maths and Economics.
